#### Considerations

- Current/former tobacco growers, former quota holders, tobacco workers or close family descendants
- Not received previous grant awards
- Earn at least 50% of their gross personal income from their farm operation
- Proposals that present a new direction or innovative opportunity, a kind of pilot project that other farms can learn from.

#### **Process**

- what is your project? \$10,000 max
- be prepared for small cash match (AgPrime is 10%)
- consult with your local NC Cooperative Extension Agent
- complete your application

- complete the project in 12 months
- share the project and impacts
